What is Family Faith Formation?

Our catechetical efforts will strive to form **Holy Families** that actively participate in the Church's mission, becoming the hands and heart of Christ in the Orlando area.





Evangelization and Pastoral Ministry Vision Statement:

The guiding principles for the Evangelization and Pastoral Ministry are to explore the Christian message through Scripture and Tradition, nurture faith, deepen prayer, foster community, and form disciples.



"Catechesis is a life-long process of conversion, formation, and education that seeks to lead all God's people to a deeper relationship with God through Jesus Christ."



- •Families will be our key center for Catechesis. Through our parish catechetical ministry people of all ages are invited to intergenerational "Family Faith Formation."
- •Children to learn about the faith in a "VBS or Club" style of format. This will allow multisensory learning through song, activities, and crafts.

 Catechesis will be at home through lessons taught by the parents utilizing stories and activities.
- •Confirmation Sacramental Preparation for middle school and older youth will have a multi-sensory learning through videos, peer discussions, and home lessons with their parents.
 - •Confirmed Youth will have the opportunity for catechesis through leadership on the Family Catechesis nights' children programming and through youth ministry activities.
 - •Young Adults encouraged to participate in intergenerational Family

 Formation nights and Young Adult Ministry.
 - •Grandparents, Godparents, and Mentors, have a necessary role and responsibility in intergenerational Family Formation.
 - •OCIA and Adult Sacrament programs will form adults seeking their sacraments with year-round sessions.



WEEKLY HOME LESSONS

- •Learning is made fun through the use of games, activities, stories, memory verses, quizzes, and audios/music.
- •Lessons immerse families into the life and seasons of the Church and cooperate with the liturgical cycle.







Packets

During the monthly gathering at the parish, families are given a packet of weekly lessons* to use at home throughout the rest of the month. These Home Lessons are easy to use and have been developed and used by parents amidst typical busy family life. The lessons bring the whole family together to study and then apply the teachings to their day-to-day life.



The norm for sacramental preparation in the Diocese of Orlando is a two-year process: one year of regular attendance at Faith Formation and one year of immediate preparation in a sacrament-specific program.

Here's what this looks like at Holy Family:

Year 1

(typically 1st grade)

consistent participation in a Faith Formation program

options: religious education through a Catholic school or homeschooling curriculum, **OR** Faith Formation at the parish

Year 2

(typically 2nd grade)

continued participation in a Faith Formation program + immediate preparation for Reconciliation/First Communion

What does this entail? Reconciliation workshop, Teaching Mass, and completion of at-home workbook

MIRACLES OF IESUS

Jesus heals a boy (John 4:46-54)

Then he returned to Cana in Galilee, where he had made the water wine. Now there was a royal official whose son was ill in Capernaum. When he heard that Jesus had arrived in Galilee from Judea, he went to him and asked him to come down and heal his son, who was near death. Iesus said to him. "Unless you people see signs and wonders, you will not believe." The royal official said to him, "Sir, come down before my child dies." Jesus said to him, "You may go; your son will live." The man believed what Jesus said to him and left. While he was on his way back, his slaves met him and told him that his boy would live. He asked them when he began to recover. They told him, "The fever left him vesterday, about one in the afternoon." The father realized that just at that time Iesus had said to him, "Your son will live," and he and his whole household came to believe. [Now] this was the second sign Jesus did when he came to Galilee from Judea.

immediate preparation in a sacrament-specific program.

Here's what this looks like at Holy Family:

Year 1

(typically 6th grade)

consistent participation in a Faith Formation program

options: religious education through a Catholic school or homeschooling curriculum, **OR** Faith Formation at the parish ("Chosen" Pre-Confirmation)

Year 2

(typically 7th grade)

the Confirmation (Purpose) program

What does this entail? 10 Wednesday sessions at the parish, a retreat, and a student workbook with the necessary forms/assignments
