Father Martin's Corner

The Spread of Christianity and the Age of Martyrs

Part 3

Though Nero initiated a period that we now call the Age of Martyrs, spanning from AD 64 to around AD 313, it must be noted that these persecutions of Christians were not constant. They were somewhat sporadic and often localized. Furthermore, different Roman emperors held different views and had different policies when it came to the matter. Perhaps, we can look at some that were more notable.

Domitian (81-96) had a religious policy that relatively tolerated foreign religions as long as they did not affect public order or could be conformed to traditional Roman religion. This emperor placed a greater emphasis on the imperial cult. He had several of his family members deified and ordered temples to be built in their honor. He allowed himself to be referred to as Dominus et Deus (Lord and God). One can imagine how this sort of practice contradicted Christian sensibility and doctrine. Thus, it put Christians at odds with Domitian. Nevertheless, recent studies seem to suggest that accounts of persecution by Domitian might have been embellished. At worst, he might have banished and exiled many Christians, including St. John, to the island of Patmos.

Trajan (98-117) was one of the five "good emperors" and had a more common-sense policy. At his order, Christians were not singled out, and baseless accusations against them were not to be heeded. If they were, in fact, arrested for exercising practices contrary to the Empire, provincial prefects would only seek to persuade them to recant their beliefs.

Marcus Aurelius (161-180), the good philosopher-emperor, was a disappointment for Christians who hoped for sympathy from him. He despised them for their lack of support for the Empire and ordered a severe persecution in Gaul (modern France).

Surprisingly, Marcus Aurelius' infamous successor Emperor Commodus, famed for his debauched and dictatorial leadership, was somewhat tolerant. The same was said about Emperor Alexander Severus (222-235). It was Emperor Decius (249-251) who initiated a general persecution of Christians throughout the Empire.

By far, however, the most severe persecution took place toward the end of Diocletian's reign. His goal was nothing less than an attempt to exterminate the Church completely. It started sometime in 299. Diocletian was taking part in a sacrificial ceremony to predict the future. When the haruspices could not read the entrails of the sacrificed animals, they blamed Christians present who had the sign of the cross and thus sabotaged the ceremony. Being a man very much faithful to the old Roman religions, Diocletian led a campaign to ostracize Christians.

By February 303, Scriptures were ordered to be burned, and properties of the Church were confiscated. On Feb. 24, 303, Diocletian promulgated the "Edict against the Christians," commanding the destruction of all Christian places of worship across the empire, and Christians were prohibited from assembling for worship. Three servants of the palace suffered martyrdom within a week of this edict. One of them, Peter Cubicularius, was stripped, scourged, had salt and vinegar poured over his wounds, and finally was slowly boiled to death over an open flame. Among more than 3,000 Christians who shed blood, some other notable names include St. Agnes of Rome, St. Sebastian, Sts. Marcellinus and Peter, St. George, St. Vitus, St. Lucy, and St. Philomena. All suffered unspeakable tortures before their deaths and refused to give up their faith.

If Diocletian intended to exterminate Christianity, the plan ultimately backfired. If anything, the courage and joy of these martyrs deeply inspired many pagans who began to take their claims seriously. As Tertullian rightly affirmed, "Sanguis martyrum, semen christianorum" – the blood of martyrs is the seed of Christians (Apol. 50, 13).

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

As we enter the second week of Lent, today's readings encourage us to place our trust in God when we are dealing with hardship or uncertainty. Last week, we heard about how Jesus resisted the devil's temptations in the desert, trusting in the Father. This week, we follow Peter, James and John up the mountain, where Jesus "was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." Jesus had told his followers he would suffer and die. The Transfiguration gave them a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming (CCC 554-56). As we continue on our Lenten journeys, we, too, can place our trust in the Lord. Though we may experience hardships and perhaps even doubts, the Transfiguration reminds us that Jesus has gone before us and prepared a place for us. As Pope Francis reminds us, "by his Transfiguration [Jesus] invites us to gaze at him. And looking at Jesus purifies our eyes and prepares them for eternal life, for the vision of heaven" (Homily, March 2014).

GO EVANGELIZE PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

We Catholics like to pray out loud. Whether we're singing the "Holy, Holy" with gusto or quietly reciting the rosary, most of us can say with confidence, "we have a prayer for that." And, of course, prayer is one of the three pillars of Lent (along with fasting and almsgiving). Today's account of the Transfiguration instructs us pretty clearly to listen. As Jesus is transfigured, the disciples hear a voice from the cloud: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; *listen to him.*" As we enter the second week of Lent, many of us have chosen something to "give up" or done something more proactive. Either way, today's readings remind us to enter this penitential season with open hearts – and open ears. We can listen to Jesus by studying Scripture, being especially attentive to the Sunday homily, or quietly soaking in his presence through eucharistic adoration.

PRAY Try driving with the radio off this week. Use the time to pray and "listen" to Jesus.




