The Spread of Christianity and the Age of Martyrs

Part 4

The Age of the Martyrs will remain my favorite period of history. It is not because I enjoyed reading about these witnesses' terrible tortures and horrendous deaths. Rather, in my humble opinion, the Church's early martyrs had written a powerful Gospel for posterity, not with ink but with their blood. Their courage, fidelity, joy, and willingness to forgive those who hurt them were inspirational even for those pagan contemporaries. They managed to portray the beauty of our faith far more eloquently, far more convincingly than any theologians down the ages. Perhaps we can recount a few stories of these remarkable witnesses.

St. Justin – Born in the first few years of the second century, Justin was renowned for his intelligence and education in philosophy. It was during his formation year in the Platonic school that he underwent conversion. In his own words, he noted, "Hearing the accusations made against the Christians and seeing them intrepid in the face of death and of all that men fear, I said to myself that it was impossible that they should be living in evil and in the love of pleasure" (II Apol., xviii, 1). Christian courage moved him, its beauty attracted him, and its truth intrigued him. So, he became a Christian, fully expecting persecution to come his way. Meanwhile, he dedicated much effort to providing logical arguments and explanations compiled in his famous Apologia and Dialogue with Trypho.

In 165, Justin and six other companions were arrested and condemned to death by the prefect Rusticus. The official transcript of the trial is as follows:

The Prefect Rusticus says: Approach and sacrifice, all of you, to the gods. Justin says: No one in his right mind gives up piety for impiety. The Prefect Rusticus says: If you do not obey, you will be tortured without mercy. Justin replies: That is our desire, to be tortured for Our Lord, Jesus Christ, and so to be saved, for that will give us salvation and firm confidence at the more terrible universal tribunal of Our Lord and Savior. And all the martyrs said: Do as you wish; for we are Christians, and we do not sacrifice to idols. The Prefect Rusticus read the sentence: Those who do not wish to sacrifice to the gods and to obey the emperor will be scourged and beheaded according to the laws. The holy martyrs glorifying God betook themselves to the customary place, where they were beheaded and consummated their martyrdom by confessing their Savior (Acta SS, April, II, 104-19).

Ignatius of Antioch – He and his friend, Polycarp, were disciples of St. John. Ignatius converted to Christianity at a young age and was said to have been one of the children whom our Lord embraced and blessed. Later in his life, he was chosen to serve as the bishop of Antioch. Ignatius was a prolific writer. His letters to the six churches and to Polycarp still remain. They provide us with a glimpse into the organizational structure of the Church and the role of the bishop, priests, and deacons. Above all else, they conveyed his courage and willingness to suffer for his faith in Christ. Notably, in his Letter to the Romans, we read, "I am God's wheat and shall be ground by the teeth of wild animals... I plead with you: show me no untimely kindness. Let me be food for the wild beasts, for they are my way to God… No earthly pleasures, no kingdoms of this world can benefit me in any way. I prefer death in Christ Jesus to power over the farthest limits of the earth. He who died in place of us is the one object of my request. He who rose for our sakes is my one desire."

His desire was ultimately fulfilled around the year 135. Ignatius was thrown into the Colosseum among wild beasts. He was then devoured and rent to pieces as entertainment for the citizens of Rome.

Spiritual Life



March 12, 2023 Third Sunday of Lent Ex 17:3-7 | Rom 5:1-2, 5-8 | Jn 4:5-42 Written by THE FAITHFUL DISCIPLE

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Even St. Teresa of Calcutta experienced a period of "spiritual dryness." We pray, we go to Mass faithfully, we serve others yet at times God's presence may seem elusive. Like the Israelites, we may ask, "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" As we enter the third Sunday of Lent, today's readings assure us that God remains with us even during those times we may feel spiritually parched. In Exodus, water flows from a rock to satisfy the people. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the Samaritan woman at the well: "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman, a sinner and an outcast, recognizes Jesus as Messiah, and it changes her life. Even when we don't "feel" God's presence, we can rest assured that Jesus stands beside us. He is our redemption and our Hope, and "Hope does not disappoint."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

In today's Gospel, Jesus breaks with custom by talking to a woman – a Samaritan woman, no less. He "sees" her – knowing she has been married five times before and is living with a man not her husband. Yet he chooses to reveal to her his identity as the Messiah and offers her "living water." But it doesn't end there. The woman at the well goes forth and shares her experience with others. Many more came to believe in the Messiah based on her testimony. What an unlikely disciple! We may feel that we, too, are unlikely disciples: We are sinners, we've made mistakes, perhaps we feel we are unworthy to "represent" Jesus to others. But nothing is further from the truth. Jesus invites us not only to partake of the living water but to share it with others so that all may believe.

ACTION Put a note on your mirror or bedside: "Hope does not disappoint." Each morning, remind yourself that Jesus is the source of our hope, and try to think of ways to share this hope with others.





Confirmation: A Transforming Journey
